FRIDAY, July 13th – Certified Clinical Supervision

Reviewing the Components and Demonstrating the Process of Clinical Supervision, by Dr. Don Osborn



Don is director and professor of the graduate clinical addictions counseling program at Indiana Wesleyan University. Don is the past chair of the National Addiction Studies Accreditation Commission (NASAC) and is a past national president of NAADAC. In Indiana he is licensed in Clinical Addictions, Mental Health, Social Work and Marriage and Family Therapy. Nationally he is certified as a Master Addiction Counselor. His PhD is in Guidance and Psychological Services with a Specialization in Counselor Education and Clinical Supervision from Indiana State University.

Workshop Description:

The workshop will review the foundational components to be included in preparing counselors in clinical supervision. The workshop will also engage participants to volunteer for learning in live simulated clinical supervision sessions. The simulated sessions will invite contributions of perspective and evaluation for conducting clinical supervision.

Ethics: A Practical Look, by Rob Morgan, MS, LCAC



Rob is currently the owner of Morgan Counseling Services, LLC. Rob earned his Bachelor's Degree in Addictions Counseling from Indiana Wesleyan University in 1996. He completed his Master's Degree in Addictions Psychology from Capella University in 2001. Rob has worked in the Addictions/Mental Health field since 1996 with adults, adolescents and their families in a group and individual settings. Rob has been on the IAAP Ethics Committee for five years and is currently the IAAP Ethics Committee Chair.

Workshop Description:

Explore the actions behind how we make ethical decisions by taking a proactive and more personal look into our ethical worlds. This workshop will examine basic similarities between specialties and ethical codes and we will see ethics from some different perspectives along the way, in "small" group settings. Examine how we make ethical decisions based on some personal examples and the ways attitude and spirituality fit into the process. During the workshop, stories about some do's, don'ts and other examples that can and do affect the ethical decisions we make every day. Time will be provided for participant's stories and discussions.
