## Addictive Potential and Pain Management

**Workshop Description:** *This workshop will focus pain and addiction, including an overview of pain basics, brain basics, addiction basics, treatment basics, and options.*

**Workshop Objectives:** *Participants will increase their understanding of the patient with pain and addiction. Participants will be able to identify the pathology of both disorders and gain a more in depth appreciation of the role of attitude and non-medicinal therapeutic options.*

**Format of Session:** *The session format will include didactic lectures, and hands-on workshop piece with an interactive discussion on pain treatment techniques.*



**ABOUT THE PRESENTER: Jason Powers, MD**

Prior to joining The Right Step in 2006, Dr. Powers served as the attending physician at Memorial Hermann Prevention/Recovery Center and as assistant professor in the department of family/community medicine with Baylor College of Medicine. Prior experiences include operating an outpatient primary care, an addiction/recovery and a private medical practice in Houston, Texas. Other experiences include his role as associate physician, specializing in

addiction, recovery and family medicine with Contemporary Medicine Associates in Houston.

Dr. Powers received his medical degree from Texas Tech University Health Science Center. While in school, he was the recipient of several academic scholarships including the Kellogg Foundation Academics Scholarship and the Student Senate Endowed Academic Scholarship. Dr. Jason Powers is an Addictionologist (M.D.) who has been voted as one of Houston's "Top 50 Doctors" for two years running. Dr. Powers serves as the local expert and as a steering committee member for the Partnership for a Drug Free America.

## Counseling Recovering Couples

**Workshop Description:** *This workshop will highlight an integration of Marital Therapy skills within a developmental model of recovery.*

**Workshop Objectives:** *Participants will determine the impact of Post Acute Withdrawal Syndrome (P.A.W.S) on marital functioning. Identify the developmental stages of recovery and the requisite skills to progress through each. Determine how to avoid common mistakes made by marital and addictions therapists alike when assisting couples where alcoholism and other addictions is present. Identify realistic and timely marital therapy strategies throughout the recovery process.*

**Format of Session:** *The session will be in lecture and interactive discussion.*

**Stewart Turner-Ball** completed his undergraduate degree at Anderson University in Psychology, Sociology and Religious Studies. He completed his master's degree at Butler University in Marriage and Family Therapy. Stewart is a clinical member of the American Association for Marriage and Family Therapy and a charter member of the American Association of Christian Counselors. Licensed as a marriage and family therapist and clinical social worker, Stewart holds state and national certifications in addictions as well. Leadership experience(s) include past presidency of Bloomington (IN) One chapter of Business Network International (BNI) and his current role as founding and immediate Past President with the Indiana Association for Addiction Professionals (IAAP). He recently joined the full time administrative faculty of Indiana Wesleyan University as the Assistant Director for Addiction Counseling (online). As a frequent speaker at various secular and religious conferences, some of his topics include: *Dealing with Difficult People, Loving When It Ain't Easy, Wasting Away in Margueritaville, Conflict Resolution in the Workplace, Winds of Change, and Mastering Our Emotions.* His past projects include his work as radio host and author of "Life Issues Today." More recent projects include the release of his "Vision" CD.

In addition to his counseling practice, Stewart consults with small businesses, courts, churches and schools. He resides with his wife, 2 children and Newfoundland dog "Romeo" in Brown County (Nashville), IN.

**Molly Brosseau**, LMFT, LCSW, ICACII received her master's degree at Butler University in Marriage and Family Therapy. She is a clinical member of the American Association for Marriage and Family Therapy and licensed marriage and family therapist and clinical social worker. Molly is responsible for designing and implementing the "The First Five Days for Family Treatment" program at Fairbanks Hospital where she also worked as the clinical coordinator of the Family Program. She has been working in private practice for 25 years and also lectures on family systems in addiction, adult children of alcoholics as well as women's issues such as eating disorders, developing boundaries and being assertive. One of her colleagues describes Molly as a "great resource and a seasoned marriage and family therapist who understands addiction."
